Update Yacht Fire on Lake Boca Raton

BOCA RATON, FLORIDA – The 48 ft. yacht, Class Act came to rest on the bottom of Lake Boca Raton early this morning. Boca Raton Fire Rescue Services crew of Boat 3 kept a vigil as the vessel smoldered throughout the night. A boom was placed around the vessel to trap any fuel that might have leaked into the waterway. Officials from the EPA and US Coast Guard were on hand during the operation. They concluded that all the fuel from the vessel had burned off during the fire. Tow Boat US placed air bags under the vessel's hull to raise it to the surface. At approximately 1pm the Class Act was towed to Marina One in Deerfield Beach where the State Fire Marshall's office will continue their investigation.
